Guidelines & info

- Incorporate the theme *Echoes from the past* in your work. Be creative with the theme. It can involve historical fiction, time travel or science fiction, as just a few examples!
- Maximum length: 5,000 words.
- Submissions must be typed and submitted in .doc, .docx, .pdf, .rtf, or .txt format. Please use standard margins, double spacing, and a 12-point font.
- Do not include your name or other identifying information on the document. This will be included on the submission form only.
- Entries will be read by a panel of local authors, teens on the organizing committee, and library staff.
- Submissions will be judged on incorporation of the theme, character and plot development, structure, creativity and mechanics (spelling, grammar, etc.).

- Five winners will be selected and there will be an audience choice award given at the ceremony on Oct. 19 to one author who attends and reads from their story.
- Only one entry per applicant will be considered.
- The submission should be an original short story written by you in 2024.
- The contest is open to anyone going into grades 7 12 who lives or goes to school on the North Shore.
- Submission deadline: Sept. 8.
